# 1. Course description

Semester: 1.

**Scope**: total number of hours -90 including: practical -24 hours, independent work -66 hours; number of ECTS credits -3.

**Course objectives** – mastering foreign language communicative competence in situations of oral and written professional and business communication as well as interpersonal skills.

#### **Learning outcomes of the course:**

*know:* fundamentals of effective communication in a foreign language; word-forming, grammatical, lexical minimum in a business foreign language; fundamentals of speech culture (including business communication); classification of business letters;

be able: use general language and special reference resources; deal with various situations of business interaction and communicate with foreign partners in the course of professional and business discussions; understand the details and general content of official correspondence; determine the classification of documents; draw up business letters of various communicative types; be able to demonstrate: communicative experience in professional interaction at the verbal level;

have the skills of: using professional terminology in oral and written spheres of professional and business communication;

solve independently issues related to the analysis of foreign-language sources of information to obtain data necessary for performing professional tasks and making professional decisions;

preparation of individual presentations on a wide range of academic and professional topics; argumentation of your point of view on current problems in a formal and informal interaction on professional topics.

Required educational components (prerequisites, co-requisites, post-requisites): foreign language, foreign language for specific purposes, Ukrainian and foreign culture, business Ukrainian language, preparation of a master's degree project.

**Course content:** Topic 1. Business letter of international standard. Topic 2. Types of business letters. Topic 3. Covering letter as one of the employment letters within employment process. Topic 4. Content, structure and formats of CV.

Forms of final control: credit (semester 1).

**Tools for diagnosing learning success:** individual tasks (presentations, writing business letters), exercises (receptive, reproductive, productive), questions for current and final controls.

Language of instruction: English.

# 3. Course policy:

- 3.1 Mandatory observance of academic integrity by higher education students, namely:
- independent performance of all activities, tasks, forms of control provided by this academic course working program;
- references to the sources of information if ideas, developments, statements, information are used:
- compliance with the legislation on copyright and related rights;
- providing reliable information on the results of their own educational (scientific, creative) activities, used research methods and sources of information.
- 3.2 Recognition of learning outcomes obtained in non-formal education is allowed.
- 3.3 To obtain a minimum positive grade in the course, it is necessary to obtain the minimum number of points for each topic and modular control.
- 3.4 In case of late execution of works, the number of points is reduced by 30%.
- 3.5 Postponement of delivery/retaking:
- it is possible to extend the deadline for submission of works for good reasons (sick leave, academic mobility, etc.), which must be notified to the teacher in advance;
- without good reason the number of points scored is reduced by 30%.
- 3.6 When plagiarism is detected, the work is returned to a student and a new version of the task is issued.
- 3.7 Missed classes are completed by a student in accordance with the individual schedule agreed with a teacher in case of insufficient points to obtain a minimum positive grade in the discipline.
- 3.8 Assessment appeal: a student makes a request to the teacher, who reviews the available results of the student's educational activities to be assessed. Under objective conditions (technical errors, etc.), the points scored may increase. If a student claims a higher score and considers the evaluation of his educational activities results by the teacher biased, the department creates a commission of three teachers, which offers the student in a certain form (oral or written) to demonstrate the acquired knowledge, skills and abilities in the discipline. Scores can be increased if the student confirms the level of knowledge declared by him.
