The purpose of the course – formation of future specialists' systematic knowledge of the theoretical foundations and modern organization of trade activities of domestic and foreign trade enterprises and organizations, acquaintance with the methods of economic and mathematical calculations, modeling of market situations, solving complex problems.

The results of discipline' studying:

to know: types and main directions of development of trade enterprises; the sequence of passing of goods on the way from production to consumption; organizational and economic problems of wholesale and retail trade; state and ways of development of trade warehousing; rational methods of supply, its optimal parameters; the procedure and main directions of creating progressive models of trade customer service; organization of transport-forwarding and container operations; organization of work in warehouses and shops;

be able: to determine the best methods of selling goods; to justify effective options location of a commercial enterprise; to perform an analysis of the effectiveness of the use of retail space of different types of stores; to optimize trade and technological solutions in promoting goods on the market; to organize internal warehousing trade and technological operations; to organize in-store trade and technological operations; to take measures in order to improve the quality of trade services to consumers;

be able to demonstrate: necessary theoretical and practical knowledge of organizational construction of wholesale and retail trade, organization of wholesale trade, organization of transportation of goods, containers and organization of container economy, organization of retail trade and improvement of trade and technological processes and operations;

to possess the skills in: teamwork, finding legal and economic information for making grounded administrative business decisions using modern methods and tools of trade activities for the organization of new progressive forms of trade and improving the economic mechanism of the industry; trade and technological processes, packaging and transport economy; business communication;

to solve independently: tasks and problems of increasing the efficiency of business in the field of trade.

Required training components (prerequisites, co-requisites, post-requisites): basics of entrepreneurship, business economics, statistics, finance, service management, marketing.

Organization of trade and technological process in the store. Topic 6. Organization of sales of goods and customer service in stores. Topic 7. Non-store forms of trade services. Topic 8. Norms and rules of trade service. Topic 9. Organizational foundations of wholesale trade. Topic 10. Organization of wholesale purchases and sales of goods and their documentation. Topic 11. Warehouse network. Topic 12. Organization of technological processes and work in warehouses. Topic 13. Organization and technology of supply of retail trade network. Topic 14. Organization of trade and freight forwarding services. Topic 15. Organization and technology of container operations in trade.

Types of training lessons: lecture, practical, consultation.

Forms of final control: test (semester $\underline{5}$), exam (semester $\underline{6}$).

Tools for diagnosing studying success: individual tasks, list of questions, sets of test tasks for current control, sets of test tasks for final control.

3. Course policy:

- 3.1. Mandatory observance of academic integrity by students, namely:

- 3.2. Current control is carried out during practical classes and aims to check the level of readiness of higher education students to perform specific work. - 3.3. After each content module, a control event is held in the form of a modular test in order to check the level of assimilation of material by students. Execution of modular tests is a mandatory measure of the boundary section of students' knowledge, which allows the teacher to orient in the directions and forms of further work and teaching the discipline. This event helps students to consolidate the knowledge of a particular content module and accumulate points.
- 3.4. Works that are submitted in violation of deadlines without valid reason are evaluated at a lower grade. Rearrangement of modules takes place with the permission of the lecturer if there are valid reasons.
