

## **SYLLABUS OF THE COURSE** **Fundamentals of entrepreneurship**

**Level of higher education:** first (bachelor).

**Speciality:** – 076 Entrepreneurship, trade and exchange activities

**Educational programm** – Entrepreneurship and commercial activity.

**Discipline status** – obligatory.

**Lecturer:** Dudko Pavlo, associate professor of entrepreneurship and business.

### **1. Course annotation:**

**Semester:** 2.

**Module volume:** total number of hours – 180, of them: lectures – 24 hours, practical – 24 hours, individual work – 132 hours; number of ECTS credits – 6.

**The purpose of the course** – acquisition by students of basic knowledge on the organization and functioning of entrepreneurial activity, management and exchange business - components of the foundations of entrepreneurship in market economic relations.

#### **The results of discipline' studying:**

*to know:* theoretical principles of business, trade and exchange activities;

*be able:* apply the acquired knowledge in practical situations; apply the acquired knowledge to identify, set and solve problems in different practical situations in business, trade and exchange activities;

*be able to demonstrate:* initiative and entrepreneurship; entrepreneurship in different areas of professional activity and take responsibility for the results; basic and structural knowledge in the field of entrepreneurship, trade and exchange activities for further use in practice.

**Required training components (prerequisites, co-requisites, post-requisites):** computer mathematical modeling, entrepreneurship: development and evaluation, global business, international business development strategies, international business and stock markets, stock exchange e-commerce, business risk and crisis management, innovative entrepreneurship and technology transfer.

**Course content:** Topic 1. The essence of entrepreneurship. The main types of entrepreneurial activity. Topic 2. Organization of entrepreneurship. Topic 3. Entrepreneurs. Topic 4. Organizational characteristics of the main business entities. Topic 5. Registration of enterprises of various forms of ownership. Topic 6. Licensing and patenting of activities. Topic 7. The order of liquidation of the enterprise and suspension of activity. Topic 8. Sources of business financing. Topic 9. Risks in business. Topic 10. Business protection and business secrecy.

**Forms of final control:** exam (semester 2).

**Tools for diagnosing studying success:** individual tasks, problems, list of questions for oral control, sets of test tasks for thematic and final controls.

**Language of studying:** Ukrainian, English.

**3.Course policy:**

3.1. Mandatory observance of academic integrity by students, namely:

- without valid reason is estimated at 1 point.

3.5. If plagiarism is detected, the work can receive 50% of the maximum score for this work.

3.6. The student can work out missed practical classes on the following practical classes, having received an additional task for the missed lesson.

3.7. If a student does not agree with the assessment for his work, he has the right to appeal it, citing convincing evidence of its correctness.
