1. Course description

Culture of the Renaissance. Topic 7. Baroque era. Culture of the Enlightenment. Topic 8. Ukrainian and foreign culture of the XIX century. Topic 9. Ukrainian and foreign culture of the twentieth century. Topic 10. Contemporary Ukrainian culture and its entry into the world space.

3. Course policy:

3.1. Policy on the organization of classroom and extracurricular activities:
